The events, optional tours and sign-up info for the October Reunion is included in this newsletter. We have a great location and room rate for a DC reunion, and we are working on some fairly unique tours, one to the CIA Headquarters & Museum (max of 30 US citizens, and it may require a day early arrival) and another for a dedicated group tour of the White House (max of 50 people), so sign-up early to get on those events. A key event will be a Memorial Service remembering our deceased classmates at the spectacular new AF Memorial. The Reunion Registration process will be handled by Armed Forces Reunions, Inc. this year. Due to the location, meals, fees and taxes have driven up our registration costs somewhat, but I think the overall program we are offering will help to offset that aspect. FINANCIAL REPORT - We currently have \$3,525 in the bank, \$1,000 for reunion up front expenses, \$1,882 for memorial project fund and \$643 in our general operating fund. What we spend for reunion expenses, we can expect to be recovered from reunion registration payments. Once the Lackland AFB Memorial benches are completed and installed this Spring, we will have about \$900 final payout for that project, leaving slightly more than \$600 for the Lackland Heritage Museum project. Bottom line is that we are in good shape.

MEMORIAL PROJECT UPDATES: The completion of the two OCS benches for Lackland's Memorial Park was delayed due to the company's owner dying, and his son having to deal with several employee issues. However, they are now scheduled to be completed by the end of March, and the Civil Engineers are preparing the site for their installation sometime in April. Regarding the Lackland Heritage Museum project, we have a display case and walled enclosure in place but containing only a few artifacts on display. The current game plan is to install an electronic picture frame showing a series of OCS photos, and to mount a series of charts on the walls outlining the program and its successes. TOUR DESCRIPTIONS

CIA TOUR Friday, October 9

The CIA Museum supports the Agency's operational, recruitment, and training missions and helps visitors better understand CIA and the contributions it makes to national security. The Museum's collection includes material associated with the CIA's predecessor, the Office of Strategic Services; foreign intelligence organizations; and the CIA itself. The collection includes clothing, equipment, weapons, insignia, and other memorabilia that serve as tangible testimony to the Agency's history. Many of the objects the museum holds were designed and used specifically for intelligence operations. All artifacts have been declassified. Before the tour begins, you'll be given an overview of the facility, and time will be allowed in the museum store. Note: This tour must have only 30 people to run. In order for you to participate in this tour, you must provide your social security number on the registration form and carry a government-issued photo ID while on the tour. No cameras, of any type, are allowed on the tour. All people on this tour must be US Citizens.

WHITE HOUSE TOUR

Saturday, October 10

Tentative permission has been given for a tour of the White House; although, times and details are not final. Tours typically include the East, Green, Blue, and Red State rooms along with the State Dining Room. The White House has been the home of every President except George Washington.

Note: This tour is limited to a maximum of 50 people. In order for you to participate in this tour, you must provide your social security number on the registration form and carry a government-issued photo ID while on the tour.

See the sites of our nation's capital during a driving tour of Washington, D.C. Ride by the Lincoln Memorial, Jefferson Memorial, WWII Memorial, the Mall, Capitol Building, Washington Monument, White House, and other notable monuments and federal buildings. The tour will include a stop at one of these memorable sites.

STEVEN F. UDVAR-HAZY CENTER

Saturday, October 10

This museum, part of the Smithsonian Institution's National Air and Space Museum, is dedicated to the preservation and display of its collection of historic aviation and space artifacts. Located at Washington International Dulles Airport, the facility has large aviation and space exhibit hangars. The museum currently has over eighty aircraft and dozens of space artifacts on display including the Space Shuttle "Enterprise," an SR-71 Blackbird, the Dash 80 prototype of the Boeing 707, and the B-29 Superfortress "Enola Gay." You may tour the exhibits at your own pace, but there is a lot of walking, so please wear comfortable shoes.

The only group in America that attempts to be funnier than the Congress, Capitol Steps is a troupe of current and former Congressional staffers who satirize the very people and places that once employed them. They monitor events and personalities on Capitol Hill, in the Oval Office and other centers of power, taking a humorous look at serious issues and providing laughs for millions. Capitol Steps has become a Washington, DC institution for providing a tasteful blend of musical and political comedy.

MEMORIALS TOUR Sunday, October 11

The first stop will be at the newly dedicated Air Force Memorial for a special Memorial Service. Central to the design are three stainless steel spires which soar skyward. Other key elements of the Memorial include a bronze Honor Guard, inscription walls, and an open glass Chamber of Contemplation, all landscaped to create a memorial park overlooking the nation's capital. From there, it's on to Arlington National Cemetery where we'll board park service trams. Visit the Tomb of the Unknowns where you will see the changing of the guard. At the entrance of the Cemetery is the Women in Military Service for America Memorial. We'll make a brief stop here as well. Then, it's on to lunch at the Pentagon City Mall food court. Once in downtown DC, we'll stop at the WWII Memorial and a central location for people to visit the Korean War Memorial and the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. The WWII Memorial is the first national memorial dedicated to all who served during World War II. The Memorial, which was established by the American Battle Monuments Commission, honors all military veterans of the war, the citizens on the home front, the nation at large, and high moral purpose and idealism that motivated the nation's call to arms. The Vietnam Veterans Memorial stands as a symbol of America's honor and recognition of the men and women who served and sacrificed their lives in the Vietnam War. Inscribed on the black granite walls are the names of more than 58,000 people who gave their lives or remain missing. Yet the Memorial itself is dedicated to honor the "courage, sacrifice and devotion to duty and country" of all who answered the call to serve during the longest war in U.S. history. Within walking distance of The Wall is the Korean War Veterans Memorial. As you approach the memorial, you will see the group of nineteen stainless-steel statues that depict a squad on patrol, evoking the experience of American ground troops in Korea. The adjacent Pool of Remembrance, black granite wall, and murals depict the extraordinary acts of heroism of those Americans who proved that "Freedom Is Not Free." If time permits, we'll include the Pentagon 9/11 Memorial.

SPIRIT OF WASHINGTON LUNCH CRUISE Monday, October 12

Enjoy a two-hour lunch cruise with live entertainment, narration, and a bountiful lunch buffet, onboard the Spirit of Washington. While you relax on one of the three fully enclosed, climate-controlled decks, you will cruise the historic water of the District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia. Your captain will point out landmarks – the Washington Monument, Ft. McNair, Washington National Airport, General's Row, and Old Towne Alexandria. After lunch enjoy a stroll and the fresh air on the outdoor decks.

MOUNT VERNON Tuesday, October 13

The Georgian-style mansion and estate of our first president, George Washington, is just fifteen miles south of Washington. Fourteen rooms of the house are open to the public. The spectacular view from Mount Vernon's portico presents a panorama of lush green lawns extending to the Potomac River. Forty acres of manicured grounds, including Washington's Tomb, pleasure gardens and restored dependencies are available for visitors to enjoy. Your admission includes a 10% discount in the gift shop. Following the tour, enjoy lunch at the Mount Vernon Inn, featuring Beef Pot Pye, dessert, and beverage. Before heading back to the hotel, be sure to check out the Donald W. Reynolds Museum and Education Center. It features 23 gallery and theater experiences – many of them with interactive technology – that illuminate the detailed story of Washington's life, including his military and presidential careers. **Note: This is a walking tour – please wear appropriate shoes.**

The Metro provides transportation into the city to visit any of Washington's many world-famous museums and monuments. If you are driving, please feel free to contact the hotel directly for directions. Each guest room features cable TV with Pay Per View and games. The hotel has a fully equipped health club or treat yourself to a swim in the enclosed rooftop pool. The hotel's gift shop is located in the lobby. Best of all, Doubletree's famous homemade chocolate chip cookies will be waiting for you the night you arrive! The hotel offers handicapped accessible and non-smoking rooms, which are based on availability. Please request these special accommodations when making your reservation.

Self-parking is available in the hotel's garage for 63rd Officer Candidate Wing Association attendees at a discounted rate of \$12 per day (this does not include valet parking). Check-in time is 3:00pm, and check-out is 12:00 noon. *The Café*, serves breakfast, lunch, and dinner and has a charming atmosphere. *Window's Over Washington Restaurant*, serves dinner only on Friday and Saturday. Offering Continental and New American cuisine plus a spectacular view, *The Skydome*, a revolving rooftop lounge, is well known as one of the city's most popular nightspots. *The Lobby Bar* serves drinks and hors d'oeuvres. Room service is available.

The Doubletree Hotel provides free shuttle service to and from Ronald Reagan National Airport from 5am until 12am. It departs the hotel every 30 minutes and proceeds to the airport to drop off and pick up passengers. It then returns to the hotel. In addition, during peak travel times – 6am-10am and 5pm-11pm, it departs & then returns every 15 minutes. Please follow the signs for ground transportation to catch the shuttle.

The hotel has limited RV parking, located behind the hotel; parking for RVs will be at the discounted group parking rate of \$25 per day.
